

Sermon Discussion Guide:

God is Infinite

Scripture: **Psalm 90:1-2**

Series: **God Is**

Sunday, January 19, 2020

OVERVIEW

Our God is a limitless God. There is nothing beyond His reach, grasp or understanding. But, contrary to that, we are limited by all things in our lives. Our time, strength, knowledge, and love are all limited. God knows each one of us and has no limits to His person. Where we lack, God is never lacking. Even as we ran or run away from God, we can't escape. One of the greatest examples of God's infinity is His limitless love. This is shown in the redemption and salvation of His people. The infinity of God means that **God is free from all limitations outside of Himself.**

CORROBORATING TEXTS

2 Chronicles 20:6; Psalm 145:1-3; Psalm 145:9; Ephesians 3:19-19; Psalm 90: Psalm 102:25-28; Jeremiah 23:23-24; Psalm 139:7-12; Psalm 23; Acts 17; Ephesians 3:14-19; Romans 5:6-11.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. What do we learn about God's perfection in 2 Chronicles 20:6? [*God is exalted, sovereign and powerful. He is infinite love, power and goodness.*] In your life, what are some examples of God's infinity? How do we take comfort in the fact that He balances infinite power with infinite love? How does this help us in our struggles?
2. Consider God's infinite power. What are other examples of God's power in scripture?
3. Think about God's infinite goodness. How does God's goodness differ from the societal view of man's goodness? How does His perfection and goodness affect the believer? What if our God was not good? How would that change our relationship?
4. What does God's infinite love mean for believers? Pastor Joe said, "God's infinite love is our salvation and our life." How does God's love offer protection and comfort in our weakness?
5. God is eternal—not bound by time, having no beginning or end. He is never changing throughout eternity. What encouragement comes from this truth?
6. Our God is omnipresent—present everywhere at the same time, filling all space at all times. What comes to mind when you think of God in this way? Pastor Joe mentioned that we cannot be lost or forgotten, but also that "we live before the face of God, whether we realize it or not". How does this tie into God's perfection, eternity and immensity?
