OVERVIEW

Too often, we think of God as common, or like us. But scripture paints a very different picture. **The holiness of God is his otherness. He is set apart from and exalted above his creation.** In this passage, we see that Isaiah's sudden awareness of the Lord's Holy nature resulted in humility and a desire to live a holy life.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. Why are we drawn to think of God as common or "like us?"
- 2. How do transcendence and purity explain the holiness of God? What is it about these two ideas that resonate with you?
- 3. Isaiah responds to God's holiness with an intense sense of humility. Have you ever experienced a similar response to God?
- 4. An important truth about humanity is that we are small and sinful, but what is the best way to internalize that truth? *[awareness of God]* What are the risks of focusing on these truths about humanity without focusing on God?
- 5. Why should we pursue holiness? *[to commune with God]* What are the risks of pursuing holiness for the wrong reasons?
- 6. How does Christ help us toward holiness?
