OVERVIEW

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. Share about someone you know who has demonstrated Christian faithfulness—what did it look like? Is faithfulness a uniquely Christian trait?
- 2. What is faithfulness? What is unique about Christian faithfulness?
- 3. In the sermon, faithfulness was defined as, "An unwavering commitment that is born of love and endures trials and temptations." A commitment to what? To whom? How are faithfulness and stewardship related?
- 4. What kinds of trials and temptations serve as obstacles to our faithfulness, and what should we do about them?
- 5. What motivates us to faithfulness? When scripture talks about the faithfulness of God, it very often includes a reference to His steadfast love (e.g. Exodus 34:6, Deuteronomy 7:9, Lamentations 3:22-23, Psalm 40:10-11). How does God's faithfulness inform and inspire our faithfulness?
- 6. How do we develop a faithful character? As a fruit of the Spirit, what can we say about the origin of faithfulness in us? How is God's faithfulness described, and why is it helpful to focus on his faithfulness?
- 7. How do we see faithfulness in Jesus and what does this teach us about faithfulness?
- 8. Do you find comfort in Christ's faithfulness for us, to us, and through us?
