#### OVERVIEW

Though Christmas is not a biblical holiday, it can be a help to our faith if we don't miss the depth of meaning that the Son of God has come to redeem His people. There is a danger that Christmas can distract from the gospel if the Jesus we worship is too small. **You don't know Jesus unless you know him as Lord.**

### **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

- 1. How do you feel about the assertion that Christmas is not a biblical holiday?
- 2. In what ways does God's word call us to remember Christ's incarnation? [participation in the means of grace, including the Lord's supper, baptism, hearing the gospel and worshipping together on the sabbath]
- 3. What are four aspects of confessing Jesus as Lord? [declaring Jesus' deity, Jesus' authority, our allegiance to Jesus; and to do these things publicly]
- 4. Romans 10:9 emphasizes belief in Jesus' resurrection. Does this mean a person only needs to believe in this one doctrine to be saved? [No. The whole counsel of scripture shows that true faith trusts in the fullness of Jesus—his incarnation, life, ministry and death—for one's only hope]
- 5. How shall you respond to Jesus as Lord? [in faith, confession and worship]
