OVERVIEW

The church has a strategy (preach the Word), a message (salvation is through Jesus Christ), and a book (Scripture). As believers, we are to worship Jesus, not the Bible. Unbelievers need to know that the gospel is for them. **Jesus builds his church and his followers through the ministry of his word.**

CORROBORATING TEXTS

1 Corinthians 1:20, 1 Corinthians 2:1-2, Acts 4:12; Luke 24:44, 1 Peter 1:23; 2 Timothy 3:15, John 5:39

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. John Mark left Paul and his companions as they set off on their missionary journey. This eventually led to a sharp disagreement between Paul and Barnabas (Acts 15:37). How should we as Christian brothers and sisters choose ministry partners?
- 2. Are you tempted to get more excited about the Bible than about Jesus himself? Why do you think that is?
- 3. The Bible is much more than a book of philosophy or theological ideas. Why does Paul's message focus so much on historical events? What difference would it make if the Gospel was not grounded in history?
- 4. How would you explain to someone who has been hurt by the church or by Christians that Jesus will never fail them, even though his followers have?
